

# Understanding Multisexualities

You or someone you know may identify using the term(s):

bisexual • polysexual • pansexual • omnisexual

All of these sexualities fall under the **multisexual umbrella** - identities where people are attracted to multiple genders/-gender identities. And so all the labels and definitions certainly overlap - yet each identity has its slight nuances.

## Bisexual



- attraction to two or more genders but not necessarily all genders
- some people may have preferences for certain genders over others

## Polysexual



- attraction to multiple genders (often 3+) but not necessarily all genders
- some people may have preferences for certain genders over others

## Pansexual









- attraction to all genders usually with no preference for one gender over others
- often referred to as being “gender blind”, but not everyone relates to that term

## Omnisexual



- attraction to all genders
- usually with a preference of certain genders over others
